





Your worldview is the lens through which you see and interpret data that comes to you, including history. Secular historians are not recounting brute facts.



Five Views of History

1. Cyclical "History repeats itself."

2. Marxist- "History does nothing; it possesses no colossal riches; it fights no fight. It is rather man—real, living man—who acts, possesses and fights in every thing... history is nothing but the activity of man in pursuit of his ends." (Karl Marx)

3. Materialist/Evolutionist- "We can start

with prehuman African hominids called Australopithecus or "southern ape." They were between four and five feet tall with large teeth. They walked on two legs. One important difference between them and us is that their brains were only about one third the size of ours. Over the 4,000,000 years that have passed since Australopithecus first appeared, our brains have grown larger and our teeth much smaller."

4. Existentialist- Soren Kierkegaard proposed that each individual—not society or religion—is solely responsible for giving meaning to life.

The Providential view of history has been the predominant view for the period 1400's to 1900, approximately 500 years.




General Observations on Understanding History

- 1. History is easily distorted. For the most part, we were not there, so we have to depend upon the word of others. These people (1) may attempt to be objective or (2) they may have an agenda (Howard Zinn, Karl Marx, Hamas).
- 2. History is used to provide evidence for a worldview assertion.

General Observations on Understanding History

3. Children are particularly susceptible. You are teaching them something they have no idea about and don't really know how and why it is relevant to their lives so they won't be particularly interested in thinking critically about it.


They are being taught by someone they trust, right? Teacher, textbook, parent, YouTube video.





Emphatic Conclusion


Emphatic Conclusion




